

Slipping and Sliding in Riverdale

## Dear Slipping and Sliding:

Road Salt or Rock Salt is definitely not good to our beautiful environment. It has been found that road salt can kill trees, can change stream chemistry, and can even make amphibians refuse to cross a road which can separate them from their traditional breeding areas. And of course, it is not safe for your pets or children to ingest. It also breaks down and pits concrete sidewalks at a faster rate.

When purchasing a deicer you want to avoid Rock Salt or anything that contains Sodium Chloride. Ingredients to look for are Calcium Chloride or Magnesium Chloride -- both of which are relatively harmless to plants and animals, non-corrosive to metals and concrete. Unfortunately, these alternatives are too costly for widespread commercial applications so you won't see them being used on your local roads. But you can make a difference by using them on your walkways and sidewalks. Another way you can help is by using your shovel and only putting salt down when necessary to melt built-up ice after a storm has ended.

# **CALL FOR 2010** CALENDAR PHOTOGRAPHS

The upcoming BCEQ 2010 Calendar will have the theme "Bronx Water." Possible photographs of Bronx Water might include: rivers, ponds and lakes, water falls, storm water run-off, sprinklers and children in parks, water fountains, fire hydrants gatehouses, the Old Croton Aqueduct and artifacts of the Croton Water system etc. etc.

All photographs must be taken in the Bronx, have "a sense of place," and be clearly labeled with the following information: where the photo was taken, the date, and a brief description. Participants can submit a total of 7 photographs and submissions will be accepted all year—from January-October 2009. Photographs do not have to be taken in 2009. Photographs taken this past fall and early winter can be submitted. If your photographs have people in them, a release and/or permission waiver is needed before it can be published. This is the responsibility of the photographer. No photograph will be eligible for submission and posting without the waiver.

All submissions will be posted on the BCEQ website and in September members will be asked to comment and vote on photographs for inclusion in the 2010 calendar. The concept of "sense of place" has many definitions. In this case, the photographs should somehow represent the intrinsic character of a place, or the meaning people give to it, or a mixture of both. Some places are distinctive through their physical appearance, like the High Bridge over the Harlem River; others are distinctive, but have usefulness attached to them, like children playing in City Park sprinklers.


