BCEQ Founder's Legacy Theresa Lato

February 17, 1912—March 16, 2010

In 1970, Theresa founded the Bronx Council for Environmental Quality. This was long before most people knew what environmentalism was.

Theresa struggled to keep BCEQ alive in those early years, as her ideas were before their time. She spent many, many hours working on the BCEO Newsletter, researching and writing groundbreaking articles. BCEQ barely survived for several years, but is today a strong, active organization, and the crowning achievement of Theresa's life.

Dear Ivy,

I have been watching the coverage of the oil spill in the gulf in what has been described as the worst environmental disaster in our nation's history. As an environmental advocate, I am distressed by the pictures of the increasingly oiled beaches and wildlife. Will this have any long term effects on our ecology in the northeast coast?

Concerned on the Concourse

Dear Concerned:

Most people watching the pictures of birds covered in oil and tar balls washing up on beaches are distressed and probably feeling a little helpless as we sit many miles away not sure of what the full environmental effect will be. What we are dealing with is a unique situation in that the oil is not technically "spilled" onto the surface of the water from a tanker but rather gushing from an underground well.

The oil has the capacity to cover birds, fish, dolphins and other marine life. Hard hit are sea birds that must dive into the water to catch fish covering themselves with oil in the process. It is estimated that most of these birds die without surfacing and therefore never get officially counted as the tally of dead birds rises.

The dispersants that are meant to encapsulate the oil and help break it down are toxic and the oil globules they create cause algae to die. Yeah I know, algae, not as impressive as the image of an oil covered pelican but it matters because of the role algae plays in that food chain.

As algae die the oxygen in the water decreases and fish must leave. Shellfish and bottom dwellers like crabs though do not flee as fast as the fish do and many die. As the price for your seafood dinner rises those little green algae will matter a lot. As some oil sinks to the bottom it can potentially be there for decades.

From personal perspectives, we can only hope that the oil from British Petroleum's Deepwater Horizon disaster does not reach our shores. Even so, this disaster will most certainly affect our economy and our quality of life.

As environmental advocates, we need to become proactive watchdogs. While BCEQ cannot keep abreast of all environmental topics, other national organizations work on things where an accident such as this can impact us. The Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) is one such group that has been advocating on our behalf. Visit their web page for more information. Be sure to follow their lead and write letters to elected officials and agency heads, and donate whatever you can to help these causes.

BCEQ members can be proud of the work of NRDC – especially spokespersons Robert Kennedy (Hudson Riverkeeper) and Robert Redford (actor/director). NRDC President Frances Beinecke, a Bronx resident, has been active in community issues and was featured as one of the BCEQ Focus Environmentalist of the Month. Last month, Frances was appointed by President Obama to the National Commission on the BP Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill and Offshore Drilling.
